Subject Specific Vocabulary	
<b>transport</b>	Can be many ways in which people choose to travel which has changed over time. For example, cars, boat, train, bus, tram
<b>pioneer</b>	A verb meaning the first person or people to develop, use or apply something.
<b>famous</b>	Someone who is known about by many people.
<b>explorer</b>	A person who explores a new or familiar area for the first time.
<b>chronological</b>	Arranging something by the order they occurred in time.
<b>landmark</b>	An object or feature of a town or city that is easily recognised from a distance.
<b>capital city</b>	The city where the government of a country is based.
<b>perseverance</b>	To continue to attempt a task even if you have failed many times.
<b>courageous</b>	If you are a courageous person, you face danger or stand up against the odds without flinching.



## Sticky Knowledge about Famous people

- ❑ The Montgolfier brothers invented the hot air balloon. The interesting story of the first balloon flight that took place in Paris in 1793, where animals flew before humans.
- ❑ The Wright Brothers invented the first aeroplane and completed the first successful flight in 1903. The brothers invented, built and flew the aeroplane after many failed attempts.
- ❑ Amy Johnson was the first solo woman to fly from the UK to Australia in 1930. It took Amy 19 days to make the journey. Her plane came down in the River Thames in 1941. No one knows what happened to Amy.
