| Physical feature | Things that make up the landscape that are natural. They would be there anyway – mountains, rivers. |
| Human feature | Things that make up the landscape that have been put there by humans – roads, buildings, bridges. |
| Land-use | What the land is being used for. |
| Economic activity | How money is made. What people buy and sell. This can be linked to land-use. |
| Landmarks | This is something that you can see on the landscape. It makes the area easily recognisable. It might be a building or a statue or a place of interest. |

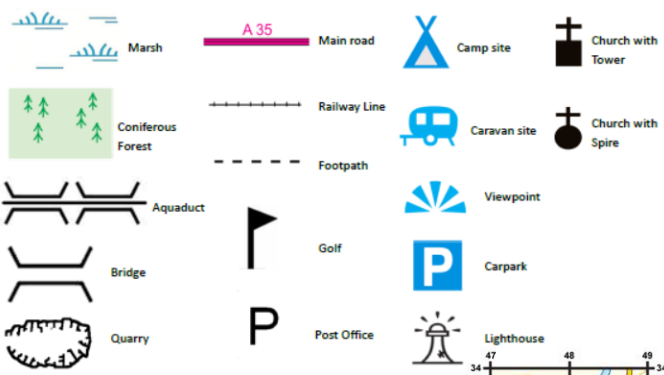

Panama Canal

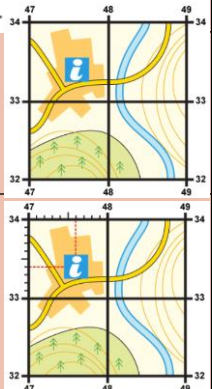

The Grand Union Canal – the UK's longest canal that travels from London to Birmingham.

Oxford Canal – this travels from Braunston to London. Braunston is where the Oxford and Grand Union canal meet.
